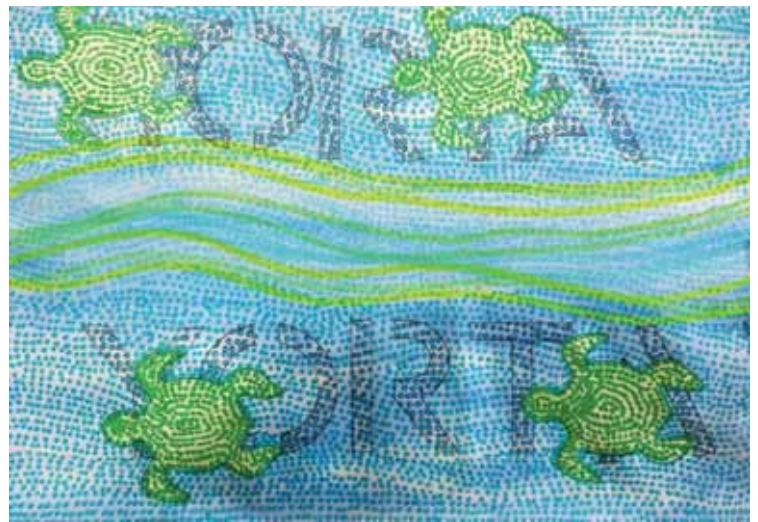
Artwork shortlisted for Calendar

With schools still under COVID Level 3 lock down (no visitors) the school is unable to host the open day scheduled for the end of this month.

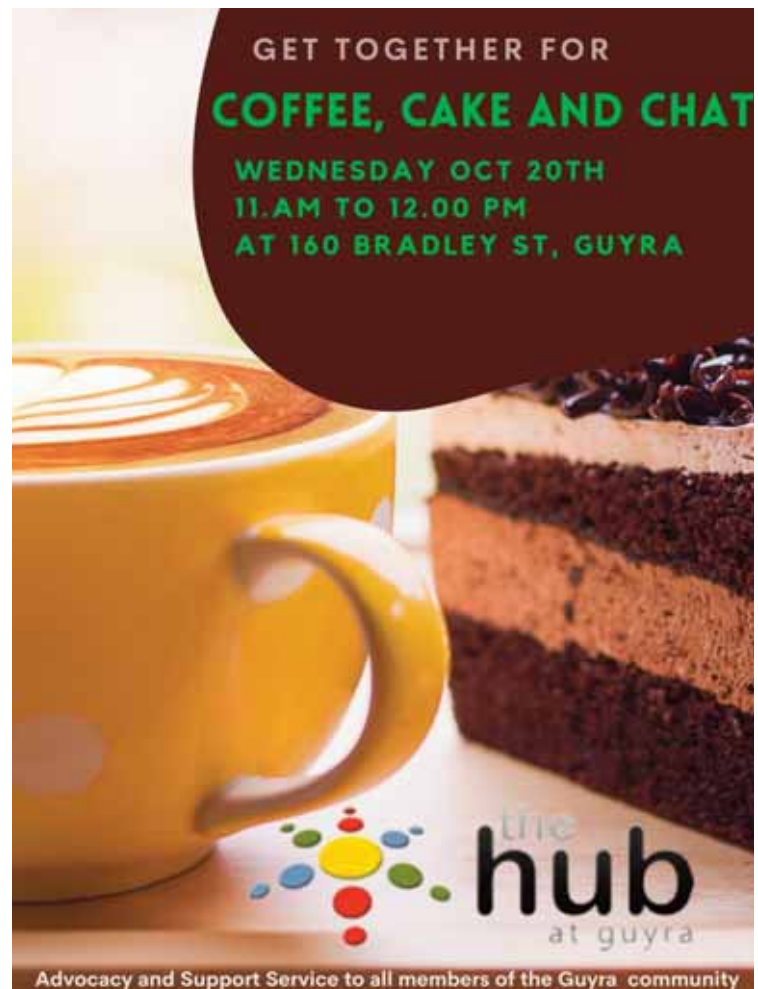

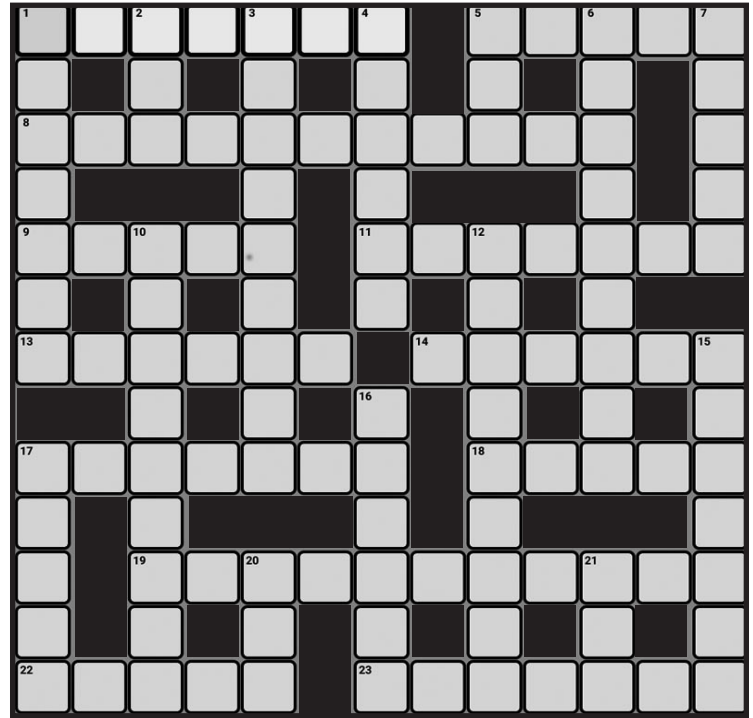

COVID update - 70% Reopening plan

In line with the NSW Government's reopening plan at 70% full vaccination on Monday 11 October there will be a number of changes to some of Council's public facilities listed below to ensure we are abiding by the new Public Health Orders. Masks must continue to be worn in indoor settings and COVID Safe check-ins will continue.

Civic Administrations Buildings – Armidale and Guyra

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16

Armidale & Guyra Libraries

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16.

Click and collect services will still be available.

Monckton Aquatic Centre & Guyra Pool

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16

Armidale Regional Airport

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16

Armidale Folk Museum

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16

Guyra Home Support Services

Proof of full vaccination is required upon entry for people over the age of 16

All other facilities will remain unchanged or continue to be temporarily closed like the Armidale Visitor Information Centre.

How to show you're vaccinated:

You will need to show proof that you're vaccinated when you check in to businesses. You can get your proof of vaccination from:

- Express Plus Medicare mobile app
- Medicare online account through myGov
- MyHealth Record
- Australian Immunisation Register (printed copy only)
- The Service NSW app (coming soon)

If you are unable to be vaccinated for medical reasons, you will need to get a medical exemption form signed by your doctor and carry it with you.

Council moves to create a consolidated local environmental planning instrument

In response to requirements from the State Government, Council is proposing to amend the Armidale Dumaresq Local Environmental Plan 2012 to include provisions from the Guyra Local Environmental Plan 2012 and from the Standard Instrument – Principal Local Environmental Plan 2006.

This process will result in the creation of the Armidale Regional Local Environmental Plan; one plan that will apply to the whole of the Armidale Regional Local Government Area.

The Public Exhibition period starts on Monday 18 October and ends on Monday 15 November 2012.

Written submissions may be sent to Council (via post or email) or made online via the NSW Planning Portal.

Spring mowing underway

If you've walked through one the region's 21 playing fields or 77 parks in recent weeks, you may have noticed they are looking particularly green and lush due to the recent rainfall and warmer weather.

Armidale Regional Council staff have been working hard over the past few weeks to implement the Spring mowing schedule to protect the health of the grass and maintain the aesthetic value of the region's outdoor spaces.

Council's General Manager James Roncon said that while there may be increased mowing, staff follow a rotating schedule to ensure disruption to the community is minimised.

"Council is responsible for

the maintenance of 270 hectares of grassed playing fields and parks, and our outdoor staff do a wonderful job maintaining these community assets, especially during this time of year," said Mr Roncon.

"Between the months of September and April, we mow our playing fields twice a week to ensure surfaces remain at the highest standard, while urban parks are mowed on a three week rotation," said Mr Roncon.

"We do this in a way that does not interfere with peak periods of use, and mowing is not carried out in the early morning as a way to minimise disruption."

The community is also being encouraged to make the

most of the region's parks and outdoor areas during the sunny weather.

"We've all been stuck inside for the past few months, so it's the perfect time to start enjoying everything our region has to offer while soaking up the sunshine," said Mr Roncon.

"From our off leash dog parks to our state of the art playgrounds, parks and playing fields, there's something for everyone to enjoy this Spring."

Women encouraged to 'go for it' when Local Government election nominations open

With a little over two weeks until nominations open for local council elections, Minister for Local Government Shelley Hancock is urging women keen to make a difference in their community to prepare for their place on the ballot.

Mrs Hancock said from Monday 25 October 2021, candidates will be able to submit their nominations for the upcoming Local Government elections, which will be held on Saturday 4 December 2021.

"My advice to any woman considering a role with their local council is just to go for it," Mrs Hancock said.

"The participation of women in public life is essential for the development and advancement of women, and the time has come for women to close the gender-gap on local councils.

"It is my hope, we can begin to dismantle entrenched barriers, stereotypes and assumptions that impede women's ability to play a central role in public life," Mrs Hancock said.

"Local councils are the level of government closest to the

community and can make a huge difference to residents and their families.

"We need women from all walks of life to put their hand up for election to help ensure local councils are representative of the communities they serve."

Minister for Women Bronnie Taylor said the NSW Government is working hard to empower more women to stand for election.

"We want to ensure that there are as many female voices as possible at all levels of government, so if you are someone who is considering running for election, my advice is to back yourself and stand to be the voice of your community."

Candidates will have from Monday 25 October 2021 until noon on Wednesday 3 November 2021 to complete their nomination forms.

COVID Level 3 restrictions in place as school resumes

I hope you were able to enjoy a change of pace over the holiday break and take some time out with your family to refresh for Term 4.

As a reminder Guyra Central School site is still operating under COVID safe Level 3 conditions:

- Staff are required to wear masks indoors and outdoors while on school grounds.

- Masks or face coverings are recommended for primary students in indoor and outdoor settings on school grounds.

- We are reducing the overall mingling of our different cohorts which means no school assemblies or sport (outside of existing PDHPE classes), excursions or field trips.

- Only essential visitors will be allowed on site and will be required to check in and wear masks at all times.

- Our canteen will operate daily with appropriate hygiene measures in place.

- Parents and carers will need to remain outside of school grounds, follow physical distancing and avoid gathering for drop-offs and pick-ups.

- There will be enhanced daily cleaning of the school and wherever possible we will ensure classrooms will be well-

ventilated with open windows.

- Breakfast Club and Homework Centre will continue to run following COVID-safe plans.

The Department of Education has worked closely with NSW Health in developing our

return to school roadmap and COVID-safe school plan. NSW Health will continue to monitor vaccination rates and transmission levels in our LGA and will advise us if settings need re-evaluation.

Rural Market Reports

Weekly Wool Market

October 9 - This week's national offering fell 5,200 bales short of what was expected to be presented to the trade. No doubt last week's losses contributed to a certain percentage of wool being withdrawn prior to sale.

Whilst the broad based EMI and Northern region indicators remained relatively unchanged for the week they do mask some healthy positive moments especially for the finer Merino fleece types.

The 17 to 18 micron range gained 30 to 40 cents during the course of sales with falls in the Crossbred and Carding sectors offsetting these gains.

31,318 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 11.4%.

Major buyers included Tianyu, Techwool and Fox & Lillie. The Northern Region Indicator remains range bound since returning from the mid-season recess (9 weeks) with just 46 cents between the highest and lowest weekly closing level. The recent surge in the price of cotton to decade high's certainly makes wool more affordable and competitive.

On the flip side of this is the national wool production, with AWTA test figures showing a 29% increase in the volume of wool tested for the September quarter.

Almost 64% of entire region now fully vaccinated

The latest COVID-19 vaccination rates data for our regions show that the numbers are growing quickly!

Almost 64% (63.3%) of all the Northern Tablelands' adult population (15 years and above) are now fully vaccinated and 85.8% have now received their first COVID jab.

All six local government areas (LGAs) are now above 81% vaccination for 1st dose, with Uralla now beyond 91%!!

Member for Northern Tablelands Adam Marshall said that while these figures are brilliant,

he is very keen to see them get beyond 80% for both doses as soon as possible - across all LGAs.

"Please book your vaccination today, if you've not done so already, or take advantage of the upcoming walk-in clinics," Mr Marshall said.

"It's so pleasing to see our second dose rates increase by 6.4% for the second consecutive week."

"At this rate, the Northern Tablelands will be very close to, or at, 70% fully vaccinated this time next week."
