New Local Environment Plan a vital tool for region

At the Armidale Regional Council meeting held on Wednesday February 23rd, council resolved unanimously to support the proposed Armidale Regional Local Environmental Plan (LEP). The new LEP combines the former Guyra Shire LEP and Armidale Dumaresq LEP.

Whilst the LEP essentially merged the Guyra and Armidale Dumaresq instruments, Council also supported some minor changes to the land uses around Mother of Ducks Lagoon in Guyra, a property on

Newton Street and a property on Rusden Street in Armidale following representations from the owners.

Mayor Coupland said that the resolution to support the new LEP brought together 10 months' of work by the planning team and was an essential first step to delivering a local planning system that encourages opportunities rather than hinders them.

"It was no small task for our planners to pull together these two planning schemes, but I'm particularly pleased that we

were also able to accommodate many of the requests that we received from land owners despite the main focus being to merge the two documents," said mayor Coupland

"We are now calling on the NSW Government to support the new LEP and let us get on with the business of growing our region."

Council will now refer the LEP package of documents to the NSW Government to seek their endorsement prior to it coming into effect.

Ice rink for Big Chill festival

'The Big Chill Festival' in Armidale will have a new family component in 2022, with a \$147,500 State Government grant to help install a temporary public ice-skating rink at Curtis Park.

For 16 days in May, the community will have an opportunity to glide across a 25-metre ice-skating rink under the festoon lighting.

A family day will also be incorporated into the festival on the Sunday, with snow machines, ferris wheel and music.

Armidale Regional Council Mayor Sam Coupland said the rink would be a great addition and tourist attraction to this year's Big Chill Festival. The ice-rink will operate from 6 to 22 May, with sessions daily from 9am to 8pm.

Big Picture CEO drops in for a visit

Big Picture Education CEO, Viv White visited Guyra Central School last week where she spent her time working with the Big Picture students and advisors.

Year 11 and Year 12 Big Picture student advisor Ms. Besson and her students worked with Ms. White to talk about the International Big Picture Learning Credential (IBPLC). This is the culmination of a collaboration between Big Picture Australia and assessment team, University of Melbourne and serves as a Stage 6 university platform for Big Picture Students.

Eighteen universities from across Australia currently acknowledge this Credential as a university pathway. The IBPLC is followed by Big Picture students who do not follow the HSC curriculum pathway into university. Entry with IBPLC is by portfolio, the culmination of work completed by students.

Former Guyra Central School principal, Jim White is a member of our Big Picture team. Jim currently works with UNE and provides wonderful support and builds UNE connections with all GCS students.

Ms. White also met with those parents who had additional questions requiring consideration during her stay. The Big Picture process also requires parental collaboration during the construction of student Learning Plans 2022 and selection of appropriate mentors. The Learning Through Internship program is an

important component of the Big Picture Education program.

Learning Through Internship (LTI) relies heavily on community 'buy in' and support. Something that the Guyra community is really, great at doing. We are currently seeking LTI Mentors in the following areas: beauty, beef industry, astrobology, physics, criminology, mechatronics, author, gut health, 3D animation, aerospace engineering, engineering, small motor mechanic and many more. 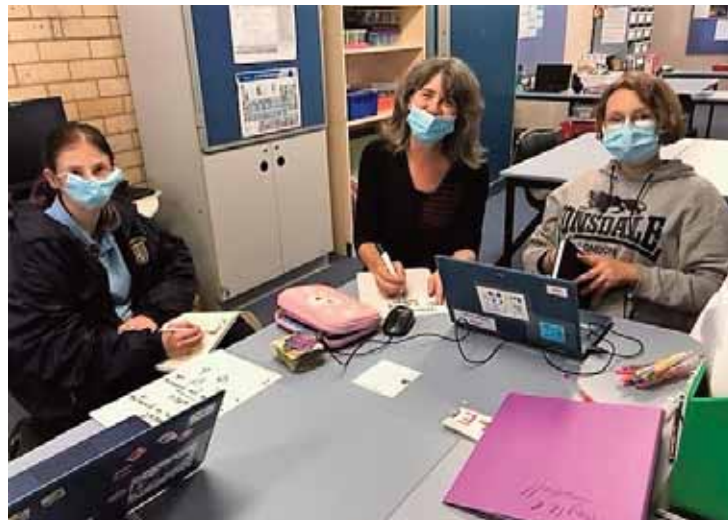

\$57,500 handed out at outreach event

The outreach event held in Guyra last week was an overwhelming success, handing out 115 vouchers totalling \$57,500 to participants. Organised jointly by the National Recovery and Resilience Agency and Rotary Australia, the event brought together all levels of government, charities, not-for-profit and agricultural organisations to support farmers and rural and regional communities living through the immediate and longer-term effects of drought.

The Guyra event set the record for the highest number of vouchers handed out so far, from 98 similar events conducted nation wide.

Spokesperson for the Rotary Club of Guyra David Pearson said that it gratifying to see so many people from the community support the initiative.

"Our small community like so many others has been truly ravaged by drought, bushfires, mice, and Covid over recent years," Mr Pearson said. .

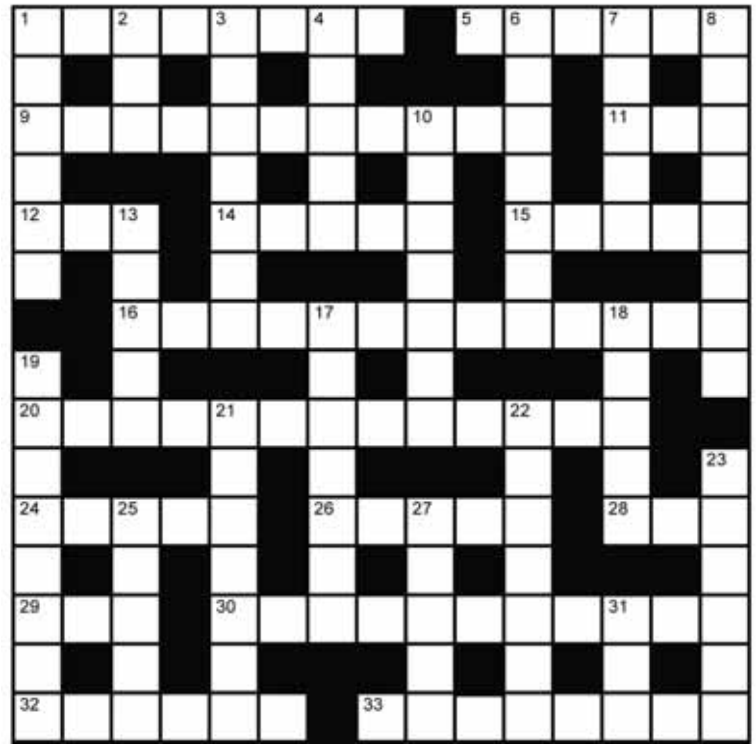

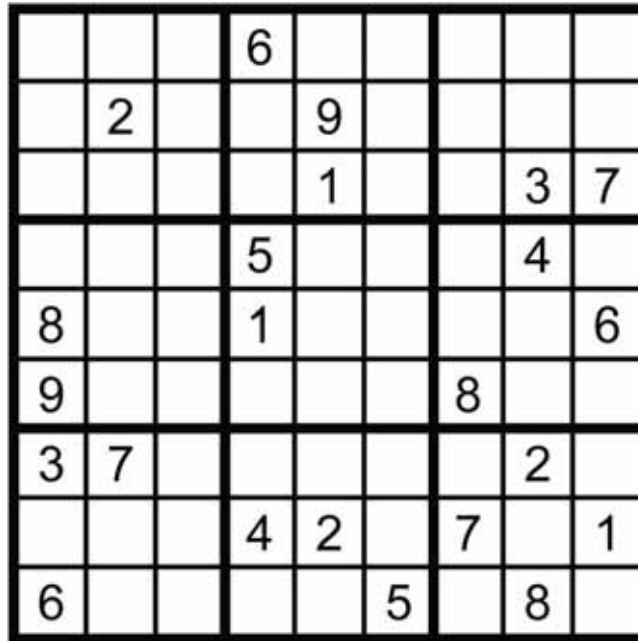

Rural Market Reports

Weekly Wool Market

February 25th - Once again the national offering fell short of the original roster with close to 45,000 bales offered for the week. Tuesday's sales opened to a relatively firm market with some minor movements causing a 2 cent decline in the Northern region indicator. This was reversed on Wednesday with stronger interest on the 18.5 micron and finer types pushing the indicator 4 cents higher.

Considering the uncertainty in financial and other commodity markets this was a good result for the wool market with demand re-

maining solid. 40,848 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 11.8%.

Major buyers included Techwool, Tianyu and PJ Morris. In a positive sign that the market may be able to withstand a degree of global uncertainty the Southern region market remained fully firm to slightly dearer on Thursday. The forward market is also displaying signs of an expected stable physical market albeit on very limited volume being traded.

Next week's offering is again rostered for in excess of 50,000 bales nationally but like the past few weeks it remains to be seen whether or not they materialise.
