Rural Market Reports

Guyra Sheep & Lamb Sale

April 13th - There was a total yarding of 2403 head, an overall reduction of 1,682 head with a majority of store lambs on offer and a limited penning of finished lambs. There was a god penning of grown sheep with interest in Merinos carrying a good start to the skin from restocker competition. Despite the imminent Easter break, all the regular buyers attended.

New season lambs to the paddock saw varied competition with the lighter drafts selling to slightly dearer trends but overall cheaper throughout. Old lambs to the paddock were also stronger. Merino lambs with a good start to the skin selling mostly to restocker interest. Majority of trade lambs sold to a cheaper trend with limited competition. Heavy processing lambs were back \$12p/head. A plainer hogget penning was also cheaper.

Medium weight X-bred ewes sold to a dearer trend while the heavy weights were marginally cheaper. Restockers again competed on Merino ewes which had a good start to the skin. There were very few wethers for a reliable quote.

Weekly Wool Market

April 14th - For the fifth week in a row the market tracked downward. A one cent decline on the first day of sales in the Northern region was followed by a further 8 cent fall on the final day. Even with the recent run of declines in the market the headline indicators are sitting just a couple of cents below the seasonal average. 38,428 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 11.3%. Major buyers included Techwool, Tianyu and Sequoia. The market now heads into a brief one week recess and recommences the week of the 25th of April The first sale back after the Easter recess is currently scheduled for a rather large (by modern standards) 54,800 bales nationally. This will be largest offering for the season to date if it eventuates and will be very close to the largest weekly offering seen in the past 2 seasons. In a positive note the total value of wool sold at auction for the season to date surpassed the 2 Billion dollar mark this week. This has occurred more than two months earlier than last season.

'Our Little Gallery' is offering locals a chance to learn the art of wool dyeing. They will be holding a workshop in the Community Garden at the Guyra Neighbourhood Centre on Sunday May 1st. Particpants will receive two skeins of sock yarn and will be instructed in the techniques to create their own unique colour scheme.

The workshop will be led by Louise Pearson who encourages anyone who has an interest in learning something new to come along. Sock yarn is a 4ply yarn which is 80% merino and 20% nylon for extra durability which can be used for a range of items including socks, gloves, shawls and more.

Louise is passionate about her craft and wants to share the fun of creating with others.

"What I love most is to watch the alchemy unfold, seeing the colours emerge and the final result," she said. "I hoping to see others come along and share the fun of creating with us."

"If anyone wants to know more they are welcome to call into 'Our Little Gallery' to see examples and find out what is involved. You can do the workshop by yourself or with a friend and it would make a great gift idea for Mother's Day – either give the workshop itself as a gift or give the gift of yarn that you have dyed."

The workhop is being held on Sunday May 1st from 10am to 2.30pm. The cost is \$60 which includes two skeins of yarn and all dyes.

More planning reforms proposed

The reform agenda of the newly elected Armidale Regional Council continues with another unanimous resolution to make more changes to local planning laws. The employment zone reforms propose a wider range of land uses for business and commercial zones in Armidale and Guyra as well as focusing on encouraging activation of town centres and enabling residential infill development in the Armidale CBD area.

ARC Mayor Sam Coupland said that Council would continue to drive a brave reform agenda to unshackle a local economy that has flat lined over the last 20 years and set the region on a path for success in the coming decades.

"The new Council is committed to delivering a local planning system that invites opportunity in and this latest package of reforms along with our agritourism package and LEP merge project continue us on that journey.

"We know that CBDs all over the country are struggling even in places where the population is booming. Town centres are changing, this has been accelerated by COVID and will continue.

"Only part of the centre's role will be retail so we are now enabling a wide variety of new land uses to come to our CBD," concluded Mayor Coupland.

Council will now refer the proposed reforms to the NSW Government to seek their endorsement prior to them coming into effect.


