Have you been to the Guyra Community Garden at the Neighbourhood Centre on one of the Produce Swap and Sell days? Running from 9am to 12pm on the first Saturday of the month, it's a lovely chance to see what other locals have growing in their garden, and taste the different foods we can make from them.

For the April Swap and Sell day, we had a focus on pickling and preserving, which is a great way to make your glut of zucchinis or green tomatoes into something tasty to share with friends and sustain you through winter.

On May 6, we will be lucky to have Julie Hicks, a horticulturalist from Uralla join us. Julie's experience includes running the Little Ladybird Nursery, the Uralla Garden Project and working alongside Life-Force seeds, a small seed company started by her son and daughter-in-law.

At this time of year, many of the summer crops will have gone to seed. Julie will be taking us through the different ways to se-



lect, harvest and store seeds so we can have a crop again the following year, and share with our neighbours. The seed-saving garden rambles will run at 10.30am

and 11.30am.



We'll also have some seed-based foods to taste-test, along with our regular garden swap, so please bring along any surplus.

The Neighbourhood Centre and Community Garden are located at 160 Bradley St, next to the Council building.

Old timber to new concrete:

\$1.5M to replace Guyra's Kaurala Bridge

Guyra's Kaurala Bridge, also known as 'Karoola Bridge', is set to be replaced with a new modern concrete structure following a \$1.5 million grant from the former State Government.

The grant was secured under the NSW Fixing Country Bridges program.

It will allow Armidale Regional Council to replace the ageing structure, located on Old Armidale Road, over the next 12 months with a new single-lane concrete bridge.

Kaurala Bridge has served the district well for almost six decades. Work on the new bridge is expected to get underway in June this year.

"We have really cool activities on offer in Guyra and Armidale from making cupcakes, spring rolls, tote bags, attending a workshop to learn safe driving skills or going to the movies.

Tour de Rocks riders prepare to take off

Guyra cyclists are preparing for one of their biggest events of the year. They will take part in the annual Tour de Rocks ride, raising money for cancer research.

The event began in 2010, when Jonathon Wheeler organised the ride as part of his Gold Duke of Edinburgh award. He took nine riders to South West Rocks and the Tour was born. It has continued to grow with nearly \$2 million of fundraising since its inception.

The ride was unable to go ahead in 2020 and 2021 due to COVID, staging a comeback in 2022 with more than 400 riders participating. Due to extended wet weather causing havoc along the usual route, the ride followed an alternate course across the local region.

The alternate route will continue to be in use for the next few years due to the closure of the Armidale to Kempsey Road.

The ride will once again take in the sights around Armidale, Wollomombi and Guyra. The tour of the high country is just as challenging for the riders, and means they can fulfil their main aim of raising much-needed funds for cancer research.

The Tour de Rocks will start on April 20th and finish on April 22nd with riders going from Armidale to Wollomombi and Jeogla Station on the first day, Wollomombi to Guyra Showground on the second day and the final day will see riders travel along Boorolong Road back to Bellevue Oval at the University of New England where they finish.

Among the contingent of riders and support crew will be a team of Guyra locals who are hoping to see the local community come out and support them during the ride, and also during their stopover at the Guyra Showground.

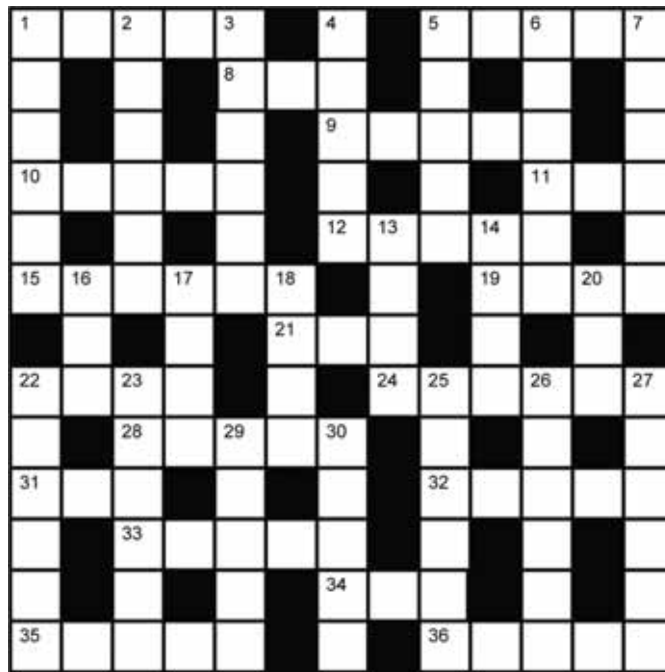

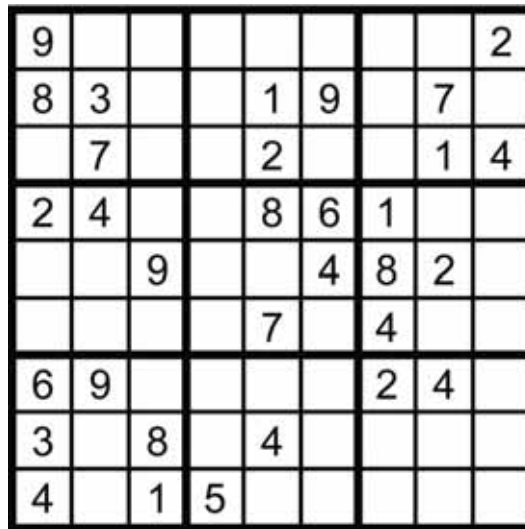

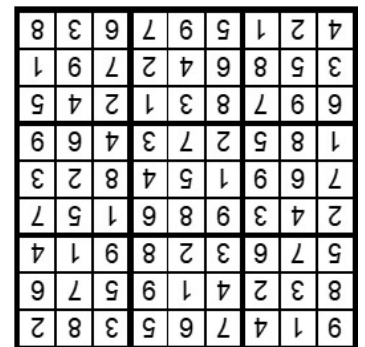

Rural Market Reports

Weekly Wool Market

The final sale before a short one week recess for Easter was originally rostered for 52,700 bales. The actual offering fell 6,000 bales short of this, but it was still not enough to stop prices sliding.

The Northern region indicator fell 16 cents on the first day of sales and retreated a further 9 cents on the final day. Individual micron indicators dropped between 15 to 40 cents for the week. The combined passed in and withdrawal rate was 18.9% resulting in just 39,931 bales being sold nationally for the week.

Major buyers included PJ Morris, Techwool & Tianyu. This

week's closing level of the Eastern market indicator at 1300 cents is only just below its average for the season to date, however individual micron indicators paint a different picture.

The 20; 21 and 22 micron indicators are currently all trading at a similar level to July's season opening. Over the same period the 18 micron indicator has lost 255 cents or 12%. AWTA test data released on Monday for the season to date is showing a 2.5% increase in the weight of wool tested nationally.

The sale roster released today for the week commencing the 17th of April expects over 61,000 bales to be on offer! This report will resume on the 21st of April.
