Inside the cosy space filled with splashes of pink, volunteers worked to pack around 28 bags, with even more donated on the day as part of the community collection drive. These bags, filled with essential items, comfort products, and handwritten notes of care, will be distributed through the "It's in the Bag" campaign to local charities who have requested support.

Organiser Anne Lane said she was overwhelmed by the kindness shown by the Guyra community.

"It was such an inspiring morning," Anne said. "Despite the rain, everyone came together with so much generosity and heart. It was truly beautiful to see."

While the official 2025 request list is still being finalised, Anne said that all donations stay local.

"In past years, we've supported the Neighbourhood Centre in Guyra, the Aboriginal Land Council, and organisations in Armidale, Uralla, and

Walcha," she said. "These bags go directly to women and families right here in our region."

The morning itself was filled with laughter, conversation, and countless cups of coffee which kept everyone energised. The table of homemade treats seemed to magically replenish itself with thanks to Emma McGuren-McLennan, whose baking treats were enjoyed by all.

Anne expressed heartfelt thanks to everyone who supported the event.

"Chris from Bean Travelin jumped on board straight away, and Cathy from CROP Hair Design generously opened her shop and donated items," she said.

"I'm so grateful to them, and to every single person who donated items, packed a bag, wrote a card, or gave financially."

She said the event was a powerful reminder of the difference a community can make when working together.

"When a community comes together to do one small, kind thing, the results can be nothing short of incredible. Thank you, Guyra from the bottom of my heart. Supporting Share the Dignity has never felt so special."

Micro grant for local artists to pop up at Guyra Show

The recently formed GuyrARTists group has been named among this year’s successful recipients of the Arts North West Micro Grants program.

Their project, a pop-up exhibition and interactive community art activity at the Guyra Show, has received funding support to help bring more local creativity into the heart of the district’s biggest annual event.

Arts North West announced 20 recipients across the region, with grants of up to \$1,000 supporting artists, collectives, and organisations to develop skills, build capacity, and trial new creative ideas. The Micro Grants are designed to sustain locally led arts activity and give regional artists the flexibility to respond to new opportunities.

Across the wider region,

funded projects include professional development workshops, filmmaking, new equipment purchases, community events, and studio upgrades. Recipients span Glen Innes, Tamworth, Armidale, Walcha, Uralla, Gunnedah, Moree, Liverpool Plains and Tenterfield, representing a wide mix of artistic disciplines.

Arts North West Acting Executive Director Miranda Hecken-

berg said these small-scale grants play a vital role in keeping regional arts thriving.

“These small grants have a big impact. They help artists keep making, sharing, and connecting through creativity. Each project strengthens our region’s cultural ecosystem and ensures that arts and culture remain part of everyday life across the New England North West,” she said.

Ben Lomond Public School to go into recess in 2025



One hundred and forty years after opening, 2025 may well be the last time children enter the doors of Ben Lomond Public School.

A spokesperson for the NSW Education Department confirmed last week that Ben Lomond Public School will go into recess at the end of Term 4 2025.

It follows extensive consultation with parents, carers and the local community.

“The consultation forecast a po-

tential enrolment of only two students early in 2026,” the spokesperson said.

“A decision to permanently close the school has not been made, and consultation with the local community about possible future enrolments will continue.”

The school is working with students and parents to arrange transition to their chosen school in 2026. Permanent staff will be re-deployed after the school goes into recess.

Feedback sought on proposed shared path - New England highway

Armidale Regional Council (ARC) is seeking grant funding to design a 3-metre shared path in Guyra, proposed to run along a 2.7 kilometre section of the New England Highway from Cameron Street to Tenterden Street.

ARC has begun community consultation to gauge whether local residents support the project. Feedback gathered will guide the development of a detailed design and strengthen the

funding application needed to deliver the pathway.

According to the Council, the proposed shared path is a key component of its Active Transport Strategy. It would connect South Guyra with the central business district and link major community destinations, including the tourist park, the lookout, the dog park, and other public spaces. The project would be the

keystone to future pathways connections across the Guyra area.

The Council is encouraging residents to complete a short survey to demonstrate the level of community need and support for the project.

Upgrades to Guyra saleyards unveiled

The long-awaited opening of the multi-million dollar revamp to the Guyra stock selling centre occurred earlier this month. The previous NSW Coalition Government contributed \$5 million in funding in 2020, with an additional \$4.7 million from the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund in 2024, to overhaul both the Armidale and Guyra saleyards.

I attended the opening of the saleyards alongside members of Armidale Regional Council and Minister for Agriculture Tara Moriarty. The \$6.6 million allocation to the facility at Guyra saw the installation of 303 steel selling yards, the electronic identification (eID) system, three B-double ramps, expanded amenities, stock water troughs and other equipment which will make for a more efficient sale process.

The Northern Tablelands produces some of the best livestock in the country and saleyard facilities need to be up to standard to accommodate that. The transformation was incredibly important as the Guyra saleyards are a central point for sheep sales within our region with thousands of animals moved through every week. In the last few years

alone, sales have gone from fortnightly to weekly with boom seasons across the Northern Tablelands.

It is great to see a bloody good set of yards in Guyra which will benefit the local economy.

Nurses face pay hit

The NSW Labor Government and NSW Health are ripping away financial incentives from some of the region's most essential frontline health workers.

Nurses across the Northern Tablelands have been told they will lose their existing Rural Health Workforce Incentive payments after NSW Health reclassified their positions. The incentive payments were introduced in 2022 to attract and retain nurses, and allied health professionals in rural and remote hospitals.

Under the Minns Labor Government, Hunter New England Health has downgraded and removed the incentive from numerous positions which means our dedicated staff will receive a pay cut.

This decision makes no sense. The scheme was working, and it was keeping staff in some of our remote and rural areas. Our rural health workers deserve better and I will continue to fight for them in NSW Parliament.

On Wednesday, 5th November, students from Years Three to Six had the incredible opportunity to visit the University of New England to take part in the engaging Far Out Science Day. This event was designed to allow students to participate in scientific exploration, giving

them hands-on experience within real university labs.

One workshop involved learning the traditional process of making butter from cream, allowing students to understand the chemistry behind emulsification. Students explored the complexities of the human

brain. Using models and interactive displays, they discovered how different parts of the brain control various functions and behaviours. Students also investigated muscle tension by conducting experiments to measure how muscles respond to different stimuli. The day

concluded with a workshop featuring virtual reality technology, where students experienced the challenge of mustering cattle into yards.

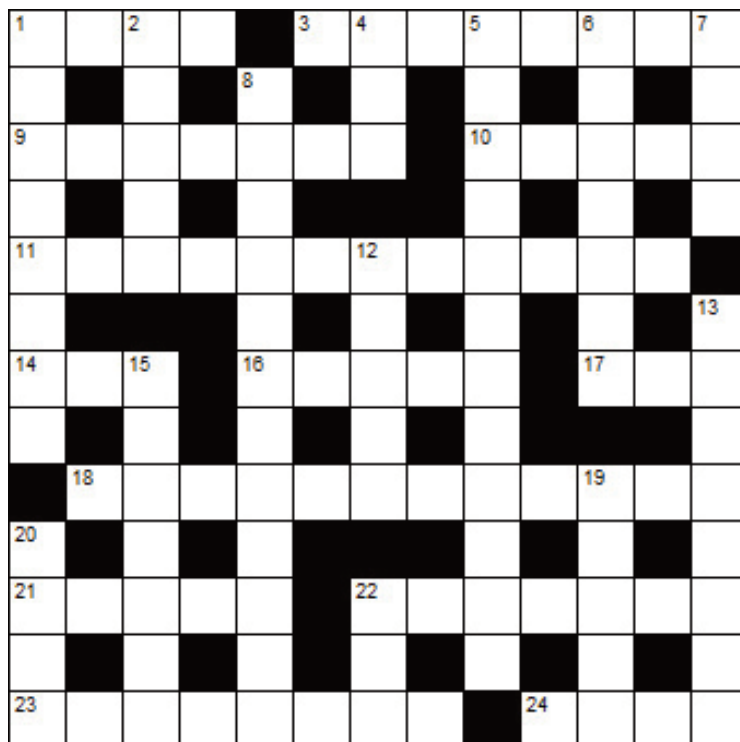

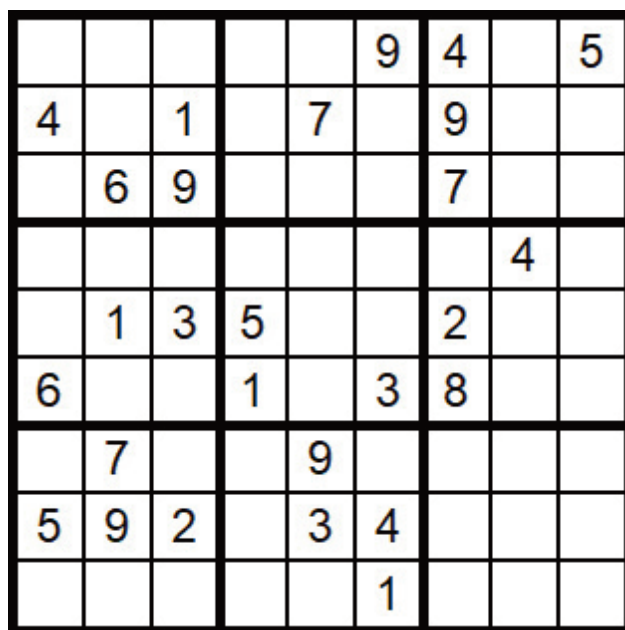
